**Haiti Correspondent.** The Associated Press (4/04-2/05). As the sole Associated Press correspondent in Haiti, was responsible for daily news stories and occasional features. Covered political upheaval, floods, and other major developments.

Reporting involved travel to remote areas, up-close coverage of armed conflict, and interviews with political leaders, prisoners, gang members, rebels, business leaders, merchants and citizens.

Received Associated Press international award for eight days of reporting on deadly floods in Gonaives, where I was the first foreign reporter on the scene.

**Haiti Correspondent.** Reuters, Haitian Times, The Miami Herald (9/03-4/04). Wrote breaking news stories for *Reuters* and features for *Haitian Times*.

Covered ouster of Aristide government, including events leading up to it and subsequent international efforts to establish stability. Other work included a series on controversy surrounding a free trade zone on the border, as well as features on corruption, child slavery, public housing and gang rivalries.

Described developments in Haiti in interviews with more than a dozen radio and television outlets, including CNN, CBS and CBC.

For *The Miami Herald*, wrote occasional articles and assisted visiting *Herald* staff members with their reporting.
